Notes on Hebrews

Hebrews is about Jesus, as is the whole Bible and particularly the New Testament. Hebrews demonstrates that Jesus fulfils and surpasses the Old Testament (covenant) and as the author does so he issues exhortations and warnings in the light of all that Jesus Christ is.

In chapter one Jesus is portrayed as the revelation of God—his clear way of speaking now to humanity. Jesus is the heir of all things, the one through whom the universe was made, the radiance of God's glory, and the exact representation of God's being. Moreover, everything is ustained by Jesus' word, he has provided purification for sins and is sitting at the right hand of God. Even more startlingly, the writer of Hebrews shows God addressing Jesus as God, through one of the Messianic Psalms. As such Jesus is demonstrably greater than angels.

In chapter 2, verse one, we have the word, "Therefore..." - a word that punctuates the letter. We might paraphrase it, "As a result of what I have just shown you about Jesus, now, do this!" - or in this case, "Pay attention! Don't neglect the salvation that Jesus presents."

Chapter two follows chapter one's picture of the divinity of Jesus and its series of Old Testament quotes with a reference to Psalm 8 and the assertion that Jesus was also fully human and not only able to sympathise with out human condition, but also able to atone for the sins of humanity.

Chapter 3:1 starts agin with the word, "Therefore... fix your eyes on Jesus." 3:7 Begins "So..." (similar to "therefore") "...do not harden your hearts," which leads into the warnings and exposition of Psalm 95."

Psalm 95 is really a central warning in the whole letter. In the light of all that Jesus and has done, don't lose faith and drift away into disobedience. Learn from the Old Testament Scriptures, learn from and be encouraged by the great ones of Faith who have gone before you and above all learn from Jesus Christ himself! Remain steadfast, faithful and obedient to the end!

You can see the various ways in which Jesus fulfils and superseded the Old Covenant on the following page, but as you read Hebrews, notice the response that the writer is looking for in his readers at each point.* The "so"s and "therefore"s are the clues. For example, 2:1, 4:6, 4:11, 4:14, 4:16, 6:1, 7:11, 10:35 and 13:15.

*A useful exercise when reading Hebrews is to jot down all the things the writer encourages his readers to do, and not do, throughout the letter, and to see how those exhortations link up with what the writer has told us about Jesus. For example:-

In 4:14-16: Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, is followed by, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. And (since [implied]) we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses,... Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence...
